Finally, some reservations about Annex A, Statement of the Report compiler.

I think it somewhat goes counter to what has been said in the 'Foreword' in that it suggests that it was a bit of a battle to get the MSG on board (though this may well be the truth!). Maybe the focus should be more on the methodology used, general participation and hopes for the future - eg. we now have a template, and the next report should be easier.
